Message from TPC Board of Trustees President

2022 was a year of excitement, change and action.

In November 2021, two circumstances sparked the transformation of Tannery Pond Center's vision to becoming a premier venue for arts programming and community events that would inspire and engage audiences of all interests, cultures, and ages in a dynamic, interactive, and state-of-the-art building.

- The Town of Johnsburg Board passed a resolution to enter into a long-term lease agreement with Tannery Pond Center for the Arts, Education and Community Gatherings, Inc. (TPC) to lead, manage and operate Tannery Pond Community Center.
- Glenn Pearsall presented TPC with a challenge match of \$75,000.

These events triggered aggressive shifts in programming, marketing, and development initiatives as the organization positioned itself for finalization of the lease in 2023. We are proud of the accomplishments achieved in 2022:


- \mathcal{D} oubled+ the \$75,000 match challenge in one year's time.
- Afired a full-time Executive Director and initiated the process to hire a second full-time employee to support TPC's plans for expanding programming; building financial resources through donations and grants; and assuming control of a community center once the lease is finalized.
- Redesigned the website and created a Logo for consistent branding and marketing of TPC's programming and Tannery Pond Community Center.
- ullet ntroduced the Sunday Winter Coffeehouse and Thursday Summer Concert series.
- Added a Spring and Fall Workshop series to the programming schedule.
- Launched the first annual Community Social.
- **Procured** a grant of \$40,000 to support technical upgrades.
- Purchased a modern and programmable lighting system for the auditorium.
- **Purchased** a state-of-the-art projection system.
- Purchased software programs to support financial and donor management.

The work has just begun, and we thank our many supporters who have generously and continuously contributed to TPC moving us towards our vision with the means to continue to grow and change.


